The death occurred at the Central Development Farm this morning from rheumatic fever, of Mr Ernest Alfred Ellis, who for the past nine months has been employed as caterer to the Farm staff, aged 51 years. The late Mr Ellis was born at Tower Bridge, London, and served for ?1 years with the Lancashire Fusiliers in the late war, being at the time of his death, in receipt of a pension for wounds received in action. He came to New Zealand four years ago, and worked for some time in Masterton before coming to the Farm. He became ill about three weeks ago and was confined to his bed for the past week. Deceased is survived by wife and four daughters, one whom Mrs Kilsell resides in Ekctahuna, and the others being with their parents on the Farm. The family will have the sincere sympathy of the community in the bereavement that has overtaken them.
