A meeting was held in Levin last evening to form a Women's First Aid Class in connection with St. John's Ambulance Association. Mrs Gardener took the chair and Mrs Herrick was chosen secretary and treasurer. The class meets every Monday evening at 7.30 in Miss Gardner's studio. The subscription was fixed at 2s 6d. Twenty-nine ladies joined and the class, which is still open for membership, begins on May 24. Dr Davies has kindly consented to give a series of lectures on alternate Mondays which it is most important every member should attend. Miss Cork proposed a vote of thanks to the Mayoress for presiding, and also to Miss Gardner for the use of her studio, and the meeting terminated.

HC 22 Sep 1915

A "Home Nursing Class" was formed under St. John Ambulance Association on Monday evening in Miss Gardner's studio. Mrs Vincent was in the chair. The first lecture will be given on Monday evening next, Dr Bryson having kindly consented to be lecturer. Miss Gardner was elected hon secretary and treasurer, and four intending members volunteered to assist.

HC 15 Apr 1916

A photograph of the working staff of Levin Co-operative Dairy Co's (Ltd) working staff has been taken, together with the prize cups won during the past season. The photograph may be seen in the vestibule of Miss Gardner's studio.

LDC 10 Dec 1918

The death occurred at Pongaroa last night of the Rev. T. Gardner, son of Mrs Gardner, of Princess street, Levin, and brother of Miss Gardner, photographer, of Oxford street. The late Mr Gardner, who was quite a young man, was a victim of the epidemic.
