HC 5 Jul 1915

It is not generally known that Miss Jessie McKegg (our "Queen" candidate for the Carnival) was the first lady in the Southern Hemisphere to hold a marine oil engineer's certificate. For some considerable time **Miss McKegg** assisted her two brothers in the navigation of some of the steamers that plied up the Taieri river, in Otago, and in other ways has had considerable experience as an engineer.
